
In the past, films were stored in canisters as reels and, at the cinema, screened by running these reels through projectors. The designers drew inspiration from the rotation of the reels, capturing and portraying the theme in an impactful and modernistic movie-viewing environment. The film reels are portrayed as huge round discs measuring 2.8 meters in diameter, which are linked carefully to form an enormous and powerful ceiling feature in the lobby. The wood pattern and the lighting together create a sense of movement and suspension, resembling film reels frozen mid-rotation.

Thinking out of the box, the designers imagined the space as a cubic volume and applied a subtraction concept to shape the space. This both emphasised the form of the architecture, while also combining the elements of architecture and interior design. The space was conceived as a volume from which numerous projections were subtracted, resulting in an irregular and tilted space, achieved by the use of digital drawings and 3D models. Grey formed the primary colour palette, from the concrete of walls and floors to the furnishings within the theatres. **9**



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
