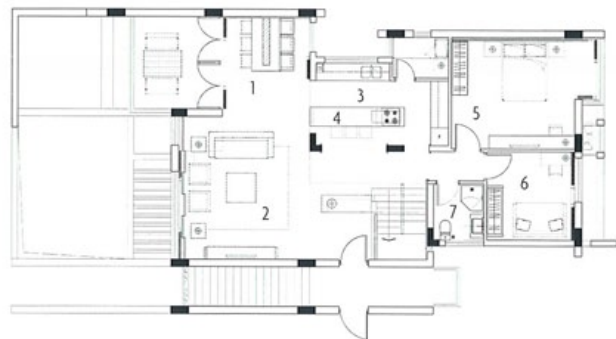

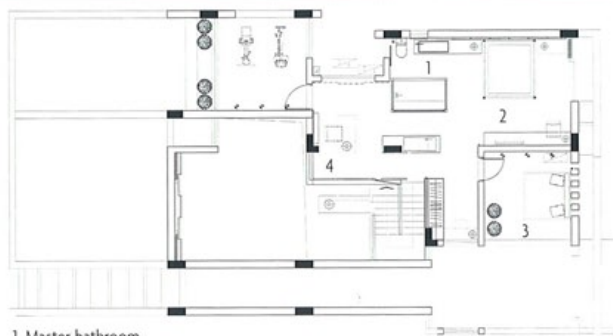






The color of plum blossoms, deep pink is difficult to use in interior design, though combining it with darker colors accentuates its elegant side.
